POSSIBLE REACTIONS OF CHILDREN TO BEREAVEMENT AND LOSS IN THE SCHOOL SETTING

- 1. Child retells events of the death and funeral.
- 2. Child dwells on things he/she used to do with the deceased.
- 3. Child is disruptive in class.
- 4. Student says he/she cannot concentrate and therefore cannot complete work assignments.
- 5. Child instigates fights.
- 6. Child rejects old friends and teams up with classmates whose parent/sibling is also dead.
- 7. Child becomes the "class clown".
- 8. Child is preoccupied with medical cause of loved one's death.
- 9. Child spends free time walking or sitting alone.
- 10. Child, at times, appears to be unmoved by the death of deceased.
- 11. Child may become overly sensitive and tearful.
- 12. Child drops out of after-school activities.
- 13. Child assumes role of dead parent.
- 14. Child mentions talking to the deceased.
- 15. Child relates dreams about the deceased.
- 16. Child attempts to phone home often during school hours.
- 17. Child is preoccupied with his/her own death.
