## Facilities Cleaning, Sanitizing, Disinfecting and Ventilation

\* Cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting, and ventilating learning spaces, surfaces, and any other areas used by students (i.e., restrooms, drinking fountains, hallways, and transportation)

#### Strategies, Policies and Procedures

The building will be thoroughly sanitized per CDC requirements prior to the start of the school year.

Throughout the school year, high traffic areas will be sanitized daily.

The district will promote education and proper hygiene practices such as hand washing.

Cleaning, disinfection, and ventilation will be intensified to maintain staff and student safety. Two electrostatic misters will be used for quick sanitation of classrooms and common areas (ONE IS DELAYED DUE TO DELIVERY) Air purifiers will be added to every classroom In areas where the air purifiers are not sufficient, HEPA filters will be installed in the ventilation system (DELAYED DUE TO SERVICE AVAILABILITY but expected BY 8/31). Box fans will be placed in every classroom and will assist in moving hot air out of the room to improve ventilation and air quality.

The drinking fountains will be disabled, allowing for the bottle filler option only, for a hands-free experience.

## Social Distancing and Other Safety Protocols

#### Requirement(s)

- \* Classroom/learning space occupancy that allows for 6 feet of separation among students and staff throughout the day, to the maximum extent feasible
- \* Restricting the use of cafeterias and other congregate settings, and serving meals in alternate settings such as classrooms
- \* Hygiene practices for students and staff including the manner and frequency of hand-washing and other best practices
- \* Posting signs, in highly visible locations, that promote everyday protective measures, and how to stop the spread of germs

#### Strategies, Policies and Procedures

All classrooms will have 6' distance between student desks to the greatest extent feasible within the classroom.

All desks/tables will be arranged to face the same direction to avoid students facing each other in the classroom and/or dividers and other seating areas will be considered.

Students will be directed to stay to the right when walking in hallways.

Stairways will have a designation of either upstairs or downstairs.

Field trips and school wide assemblies will be temporarily discontinued. Smaller scale assemblies may take place in larger common areas that allow for greater social distancing.

Elementary classes will eat in their classrooms. Cafeteria tables will be expanded into others areas as is feasible to allow social distancing of 6' to the greatest extent possible for students in grades 7-12.

Additional, creative spacing options for seating will be explored as is feasible.

Signs will be posted with reminders about best hygiene practices. Hand sanitizer stations will be added to each of the building entrances.

Nick will install touchless bathroom faucets (DELAYED DUE TO DELIVERY), toilets, and paper towel dispensers.

Signs encouraging hand washing and other healthy practices will be posted throughout the school.

Visitors/volunteers in the building will be limited and may be subject to health screening questions. Hand washing will be encouraged before and after returning from activities.

Education about the importance of following health and safety guidelines and distancing to the greatest extent possible will be reinforced.

Other social distancing and safety practices	Sharing of materials among students will be limited and the district will explore sanitizing options. Cleaning and disinfecting will be conducted frequently throughout the day using Quat Disinfectant or other available safe products  It is expected that students will wear face coverings on the bus, and students will be with no more than two per seat with the greatest distance between students as possible. Families will be seated together as appropriate. Parents will be encouraged to transport their children if they are able.  The number of students in any given learning space and their interactions will be limited to 25 or less to the greatest extent possible or according to the DOH guidelines. All groups using district facilities will be subject to our district plan.

#### Strategies, Policies and Procedures

People should know their risk for severe illness. Individuals who have serious underlying medical conditions or who have other extenuating factors may be at higher risk for more severe illness.

CPSD will consider individual needs for students and staff members who are at higher risk for severe illness on a case by case basis.

Use of face coverings is required by state provided guidelines for all adults. They are required for students including buses, hallways, in classrooms when 6' distancing is not feasible, and anywhere else that 6' distancing is not possible. (This will only change when state requirements change. Now required at all times for students and adults.)

Under the green phase, all staff will be present in the building daily.

With regard to staff being present in the building, under the yellow phase, CPSD will follow the needs or recommendations set forth by the CDC and the Department of Health.
