The CPSD will continue to abide by and support all Board policies regarding prevention and mitigation strategies for safety, wellness, and the spread of communicable diseases. They will also abide by any mandates from the PA DoH and PDE, follow guidance from the CDC to the greatest extent possible in order to provide safe and sustainable in-person learning.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The CPSD will ensure continuity of services for students' academic needs through summer learning opportunities for those students with the greatest needs including those with IEPs and attendance issues. Additionally, support will be provided to students who are identified through both local and state assessments as needing academic support by providing small groups focused on students' targeted needs during the 2021-2022 school year. The instructional support team, student services coordinator, special education coordinator, and principals will work together to identify social, emotional, mental health, and other needs of students. They will work collaboratively with both internal and community agencies and partners to address these needs. The professional development (PD) committee and administrators are working to address social, emotional, mental health, and other needs for staff members based on a PD survey. These opportunities will be provided during the 2021-2022 school year.

c. Handwashing and respiratory etiquette ;	Signs for proper handwashing and respiratory etiquette will be placed in appropriate places in the building. Teachers will remind students of the appropriate procedures for both as well.
d. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation ;	Updates to HVAC systems are being planned to improve ventilation in the building. Cleaning protocols are established with the environmental/cleaning contractor. Policy 703, Sanitary Management, provides guidance and procedures for maintaining a sanitary environment.

Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine , in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	The school nurse and administrators will conduct contact tracing and reporting according to guidelines provided by and in cooperation with the DoH. The COVID School Symptom Screening Tool is used by the school nurse to screen students as well as sent home to parents
f. Diagnostic and screening testing;	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ask parents to screen students prior to arriving at school for COVID symptoms using the School Symptom Screening Tool sent home by the school nurse. 2. Teachers will monitor students for any COVID symptoms and send any student exhibiting symptoms to the nurse. 3. School nurse will assess symptoms according COVID Symptom Screen Tool and make recommendation based on the assessment.
g. Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities ;	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The school will be available to be a vaccination site as needed. 2. Vaccination information and site availability will be posted on the website.
